This definition includes computers, which can also "calculate". Computer thinking is abstract, made of abstract words like red and green that require definitions to know what they mean. While consciousness is phenomenal, it is not abstract. Its calculators run on actual physical qualities, like redness and greenness. These physical qualities don't require a dictionary, since they are the definition. **of This, This**.
