It allows for ideas to be 'of fully fleshed out'	Some say it creates an echo chamber.
Kialo allows for filtering of "up votes" like spam and trolling before they appear on the website.	There's a lot of criticism about it, because it's not conducive to everyone for openly talking about their ideas without biased backlash.
There is little interference by the admins of the entire website in discussions.	A lot of people don't know about it, and thus don't use it.
