Pros	Cons
If the big bang started our universe, it probably was part of a chain reaction of other universes too (called <a href="#">bubble universe</a> ).	It's likely that we don't live in a black hole, as new material gets injected into our universe all the time (what's in the universe now is what we started with).
Since it can't be disproven, there's no reason to rule it out.	The universe keeps expanding without stopping (like bumping into something), it's likely that there's nothing, no other universes, out there.
There are fluctuations in the <a href="#">cosmic microwave background (CMB)</a> that may signify that this universe collided with other universes in the past.	We don't see evidence for <a href="#">nested universes</a> , so those multiverses don't exist.
